Sedum sexangulare

Sedum sexangulare is truly one of the staple, go-to plants for North American green roofs. It is incredibly tough, sun and drought tolerant, but, also, will do well in shade. Its small leaves are arranged in rows of six, which is how it derives its name. Sedum sexangulare forms a green mat that becomes absolutely covered with bright yellow flowers in summer. It maintains its leaves long into the fall, turning orange to red, but, eventually, in the coldest winter months, becomes a dark bronze. Its habit is such that it fills in rapidly and completely in most situations - a highly adaptable plant.
