Monarda fistulosa is native throughout the United States. Its purple-pink flowers attract bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds.

Though it will grow in full sun, it performs better with some shade, on a roof.

Its square stem shows that it is a member of the mint family, as does its fragrant foliage.
