

Description

This North American Native is a great attractor for pollinators, particularly bees and hummingbirds. It is also listed as a host and nectar source for the Baltimore checkerspot butterfly. The tubular flowers are light purple on the outside with white interiors, and bloom from late spring to early summer. This plant will require some shade and irrigation to thrive in hot, dry locations. Like most perennials on green roofs, this plant will benefit from growing in a deeper soil profile or in mounded green roof media (6+ in. depth).
