

Description

This shade tolerant North American Native is a great species that provides year-round interest on a green roof. Foliage grows in a low mat featuring vibrant, dark green, needle-shaped leaves that resemble the foliage of coniferous evergreens. Foliage generally stays green year round, though can brown out in colder climates through the winter. A beautiful carpet of lavender flowers appears in a burst of color in very early spring. Like most perennials used on green roofs, this plant will benefit from growing in a deeper soil profile or in mounded green roof media. It will need regular water to become established on the roof.
