

Description

Fast-growing, with good year-round interest. Lime-green leaves turn to bright yellow in summer, taking on coral tones of orange and red in cold months. Requires excellent drainage, and prefers full sun but can tolerate bright shade. Planted for foliage, it does not flower reliably. Best used as an accent on a roof, as coverage is less-dense as other ground covers, and may die back in unusually wet seasons. On edges of roofs and in planters it has a nice cascading effect. Excellent for adding unique color to any planting.
