Sedum aizoon 'Euphorbioides'

This cultivar is a striking specimen, featuring strong, upright, red stems and green leaves, which are serrated along the edges. Large yellow flower heads appear in mid-summer. Pollinators love this plant! The leaves are longer than most sedums and grow in masses along the stems. This feature, and the size and shape of the plant, give it the appearance of a small shrub. Leaves turn light to bright pink in the fall, depending on exposure to sun and cold, and drop in the coldest months. Vastly underused in the industry, Sedum aizoon 'Euphorbioides' is one of the more interesting plants suitable to extensive green roof conditions.
